Learning outcomes of the programme of study

The study programme, based on the European Credit Transfer System (a total of ECTS for 4 semesters) has been drawn up in keeping with the most recent scientific and methodological trends regarding strategies of information in contemporary society. The study programme is designed to develop the students instrumental abilities (information management, analysis, information and documentation techniques, taking the adequate decision on crisis management etc.), interpersonal abilities (evaluation and self-evaluation), systemic abilities (researchers in the field of library and information science). Graduates may choose a professional career working as specialists in information and communication science, scientific researchers in the storage and retrieval of information domain, librarians and documentary teachers within the framework of preuniversity education system. The assessment system includes a partial evaluation accounting for 30% of the final evaluation accounting for 70% of the final grade.
