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Bucharest Workshop on *Syntactic Variation in Romance*

Date: November 23-24, 2018

Location: Bucharest, Faculty of Letters, University of Bucharest

This two-day workshop is part of the Annual Conference of the Department of Linguistics of the University of Bucharest (<https://linguistlist.org/issues/29/29-3396.html>). It is thematically devoted to linguistic variation in Romanian and Romance. The workshop is part of *Formal Approaches to Romance Microvariation* (FARM) initiative and represents a continuation of the workshop held in Bucharest in 2016.

In the past 20 years, syntactic variation and microvariation in particular have played a crucial role in shaping the principles and parameters approach to the architecture of the language faculty. Issues in morphological and phonological variation also bring important contributions to the current development of theories of morphology and phonology. The Romance languages represent a fertile test-bed for formulating theoretical hypotheses on the nature, source and extent of (micro)variation, which may bring relevant contributions to the formal modelling of linguistic variation. Given their relatively well-known history and their common ancestry, the Romance languages also present a unique opportunity for understanding how linguistic variation emerges (i.e. the same input leading to different, variant outputs). The set of phenomena which are known in the literature to be subject to intense (syntactic, morphological and phonological) variation from both a cross-Romance and a dialectal (intralinguistic) perspective includes (but is not restricted to): (i) clitics, (ii) verb movement, (iii) negation, (iv) agreement, (v) gender and number, (vi) reduplication, (vii) doubling, (viii) ellipsis, (ix) deixis i.a.

We invite submissions for **30 (20+10) minute long oral presentations** dealing with issues in Romance syntactic variation and microvariation. Ideally, topics should be relevant for syntax, morphology and phonology (and also semantics). A (cross-Romance and intralinguistic, dialectal) **comparative** and **diachronic** perspective is strongly encouraged: proposals dealing with more than one Romance variety and with the historical source of phenomena subject to linguistic variation will have priority in the selection process.

Submissions must be no longer than two single-spaced pages, in Times New Roman 12, including references and examples.

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Bucharest Workshop on *Attitude and Stance in Discourse*

Date: November 23-24, 2018

Location: Bucharest, Faculty of Letters, University of Bucharest

The workshop *Attitude and Stance in Discourse* aims to highlight, detail, and distinguish various aspects covered by these two notions while applying them to different discourse registers. Attitude and stance are the theoretical correlates that point to the common intuition that all language users access language introspectively.

A series of recent studies on *attitude* have broadened the scope of this concept, which was initially confined to the fields of semantics and the logic of language. In the current stage of research, a wide range of discourse and communication phenomena, such as emotion, opinion, evaluation, intentionality, subjectivity, and intersubjectivity or interpersonal meaning, may be studied in relation to this notion. Moreover, the projection of attitude in discourse involves a series of constructions, mechanisms, discourse categories and inferential processes: e.g. evaluation structures that serve as attitude indicators, or other grammatical constructions, such as concession, contrast, quoting and reporting, modalisations and quantification, the use of attitudinal markers and hedges and of strategically triggered implicatures, the manipulation of presuppositions, etc.

The speaker's intentionality as a potential source of discourse attitude opens up new generous perspectives of analysis as far as speech acts, verbal (im)politeness, or discourse strategies are concerned, to name but a few possible applications.

The analysis of the *speaker's positioning* in discourse – a pragmatic concept related to the one of *attitude* – fosters studies concerned with the speakers' image (stance) and their degree of involvement in communication. The negotiation of attitude and stance in discourse, their amplification or, on the contrary, their mitigation, the calibration of the relationship with the interlocutor, etc. give rise to various ways to approach these notions, from ethno-methodological, sociolinguistic, or argumentative viewpoints.

Our general, basic assumption is that this diversity of meanings and inter- or cross-disciplinary approaches may bring about a deeper understanding of the sociocultural, interactional, performative, and ideational nature of language, and that new studies into this area will help to shed more light on the (Romanian) language resources involved in stance-taking and expressing attitude in various forms of verbal communication.
